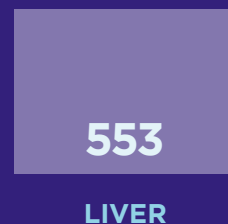

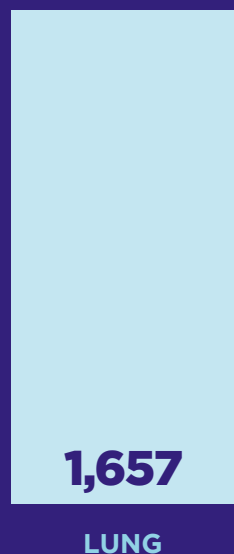

ESTIMATED NUMBER OF CANCER DEATHS IN 2020¹



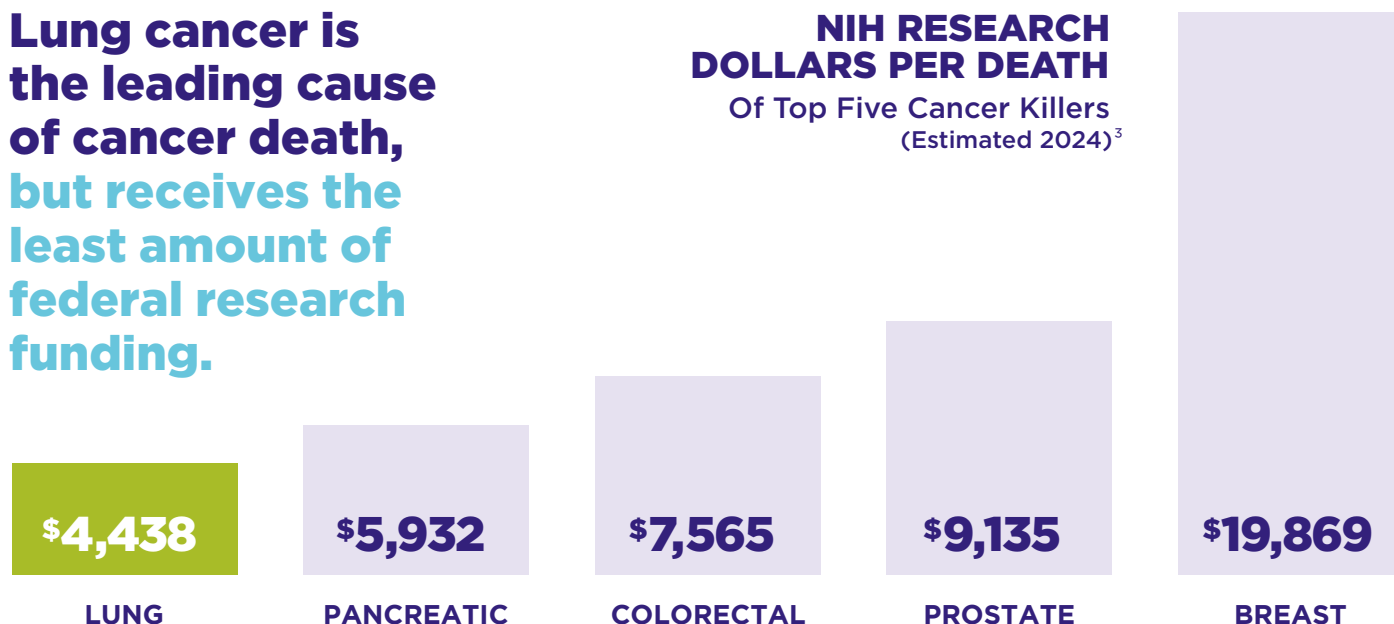

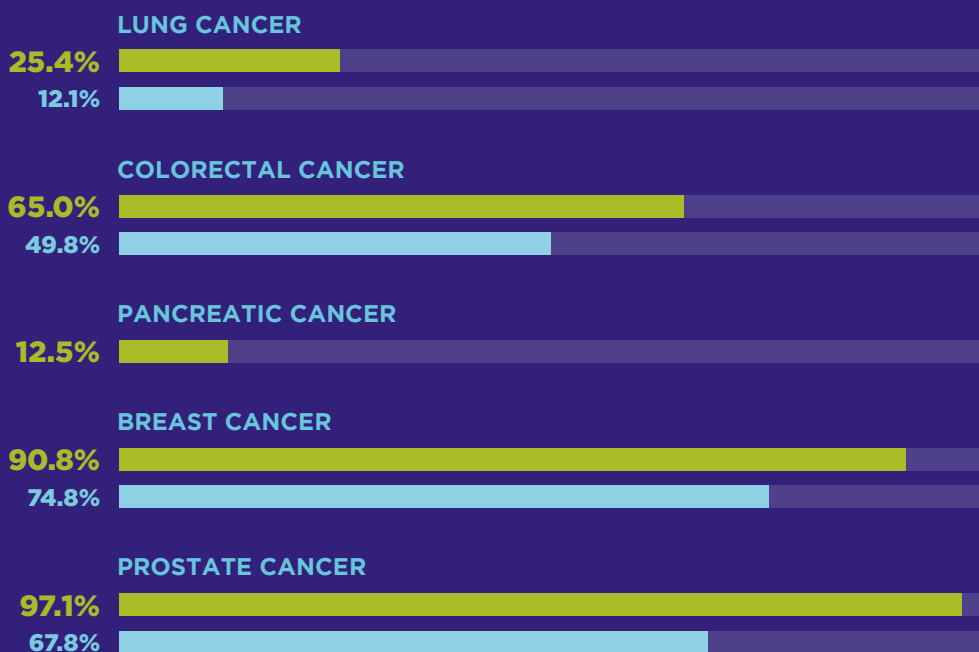
