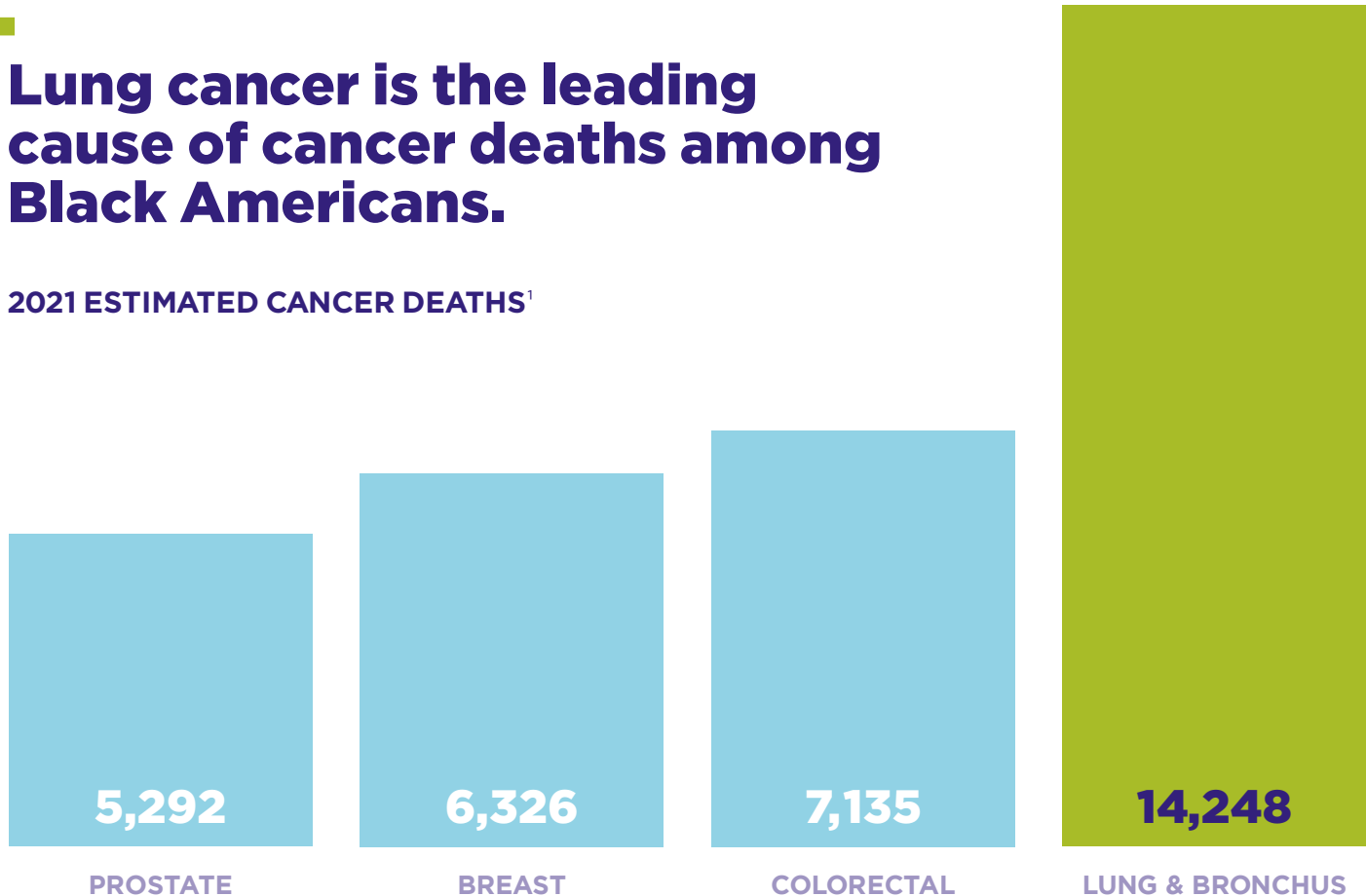




LUNG CANCER FACTS: BLACK AMERICANS

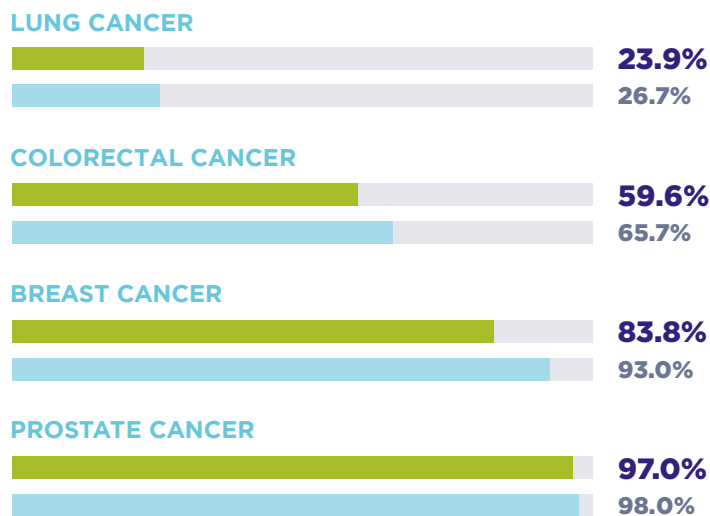


LUNG CANCER FACTS: BLACK AMERICANS

Five-year survival rate is lower in Black patients despite a decreased incidence.

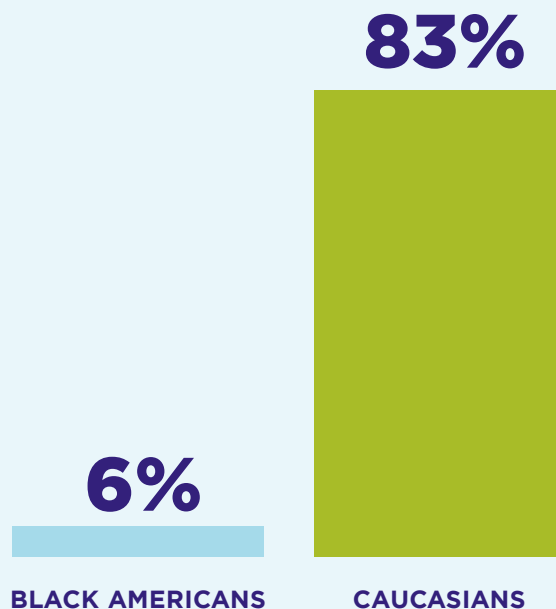
